Context: Our Learning Crisis

Globally, there always existed educational disparities among children. The UNESCO report on the same has highlighted the detrimental affect of the pandemic in further widening the learning gap at primary levels in all countries.

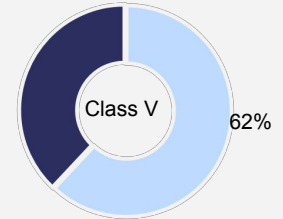
The National Achievement Survey (NAS), conducted by the Government of India highlights the low levels of learning of school children in AP.



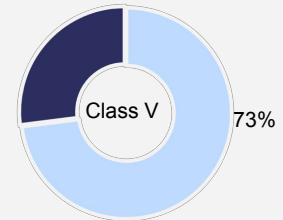
Poor learning attainment begins in early years and continues to widen in later years, making it difficult for the child to perform well. (NAS, 2021)

The Annual Status of Education Report (ASER) is an annual survey that measures the basic reading, writing and arithmetic levels of children.

62% govt school students in class V
cannot read a class II level text

73% govt school students in class V

Context: Our Learning Crisis

- This existing gap in current and expected learning levels of students is a serious problem and is called the ‘learning crisis’. If the learning crisis is not addressed and bridged at an early age, it further worsens as the child grows up.
- Recognizing this, the government of AP has taken a serious note of this issue and has undertaken several initiatives like *Nadu-Nedu*, *Supporting Andhra’s Learning Transformation (SALT)* and *School Digital Architecture*.
- The Andhra Pradesh State Higher Education Council (APSCHE) decided in 2023 to support School Education Department to improve children’s learning, in the belief that higher education can contribute usefully to school education.
- This resulted in the conceptualization and development of the ‘**Learning Improvement Program**’ or **LIP** in Andhra Pradesh.

LIP as a part of mandatory Community Service Project (CSP)

AP State Council for Higher Education (APSHCE, through its letter no. APSCHE/AC-1/CSP/UNICEF dated 9th May 2024 to Registrars of all State Universities, says the following:

'APSCHE is pleased to permit the LIP – Preranamitras participating in the LIP to complete the mandatory CSP throughout the academic year on every Saturday (except on holidays), completing a minimum of 180 hours of involvement/participation.'

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In references 1 and 2 cited above, the Government had accorded permission for starting 4-year Degree programs with a 10-month mandatory internship, of which 2 months of Community Service Project (CSP) is made mandatory.

APSCHE in association with the Dept. of School Education and UNICEF has been implementing the Learning Improvement Program (LIP) – Prerana Mitra from 2023, as a part of the Community Service Project. The LIP-Prerana Mitra is to strengthen the foundational literacy and numeracy skills among primary grade students studying in Government Schools. There are around 3000 Prerana Mitras (students of non-professional and professional colleges) taking the LIP as a part of their CSP, under the guidance of BCDE Coordinators of universities and colleges.

The Education Specialist, UNICEF requested the Chairman, APSCHE that the LIP-Prerana Mitras undertaking the LIP, in lieu of CSP, be permitted to complete the mandatory CSP throughout the academic year, once in a week, on every Saturday, instead of doing it during the May-June of the summer vacation between first and second years of study. This is to facilitate and ensure continuous support for school children to pick up the foundational skills on a continuum.

This needs to be implemented in letter and spirit!

Components of LIP

Training of teachers to teach better

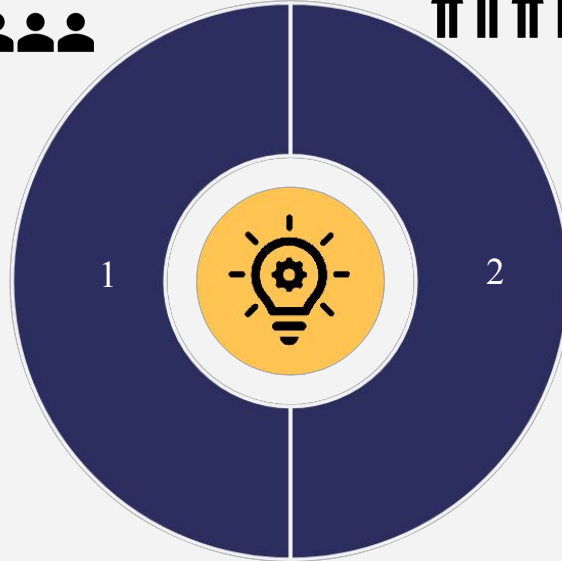


The teachers were trained by Master Trainers and District Resource Persons under one of the components of LIP i.e. for classes 6-8 in ten districts namely Srikakulam, Vizianagaram, Parvathipuram Manyam, Visakhapatnam, Alluri Sitaramaraju, Anakapalli, Kadapa, Annamaiah, Anathapu and Sri Satya Sai.



Engagement of Preranamitra Volunteers

- Preranamitras are students from colleges who register themselves as mentors of school students as a part of LIP.
- They volunteer to spend their time with a small group of primary level school going children once or twice a week, supporting them to improve basic and foundational skills of reading, writing and mathematics.
- The LIP is the latest addition of activities that can be done as part of the Community Service Project.



Role of BCDE Co-Ordinator in Implementation of LIP

BCDE Coordinator is the focal point for LIP. S/he is expected to identify students interested in becoming Preranamitras. Further, the BCDE coordinators guide the students to:

- Register on the digital platform as Preranamitras and understand the program
- Familiarize themselves with the learning activities through the 'Karadeepika' and undertake these activities regularly
- Effectively coordinate with the school teachers and the children
- Address problems and challenges as a Preranamitra, as and when they occur
- Coordinate with the local school education department authorities for the smooth implementation of the Preranamitra program as part of CSP

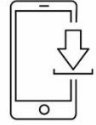

Familiarizing oneself with the e-content on the app, which includes all the learning activities to be done with the children



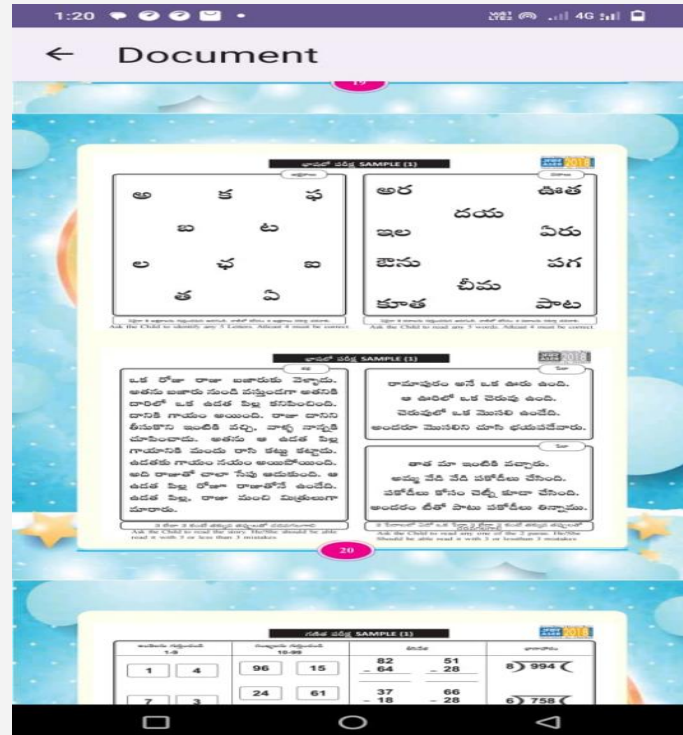
Marking attendance on the app and reporting all the activities conducted

A baseline assessment, at the beginning of the intervention and an endline assessment after the intervention will be conducted using the ASER tool in both language and mathematics.
